Canada is now second in the world for the percentage of its population playing tennis at 12.8%.

This has grown by 7.1% since the last report published in 2021.



Canada is also 6th globally for its total number of people playing tennis, which has risen to nearly 5 million, up from **3.9 million** in 2021
